W.H.O. Foundation Awards \$20,000 Volunteer Service Grant to Randolph County Family Crisis Center

Randolph County, NC – Randolph County Family Crisis Center, a local non-profit organization that provides support services to victims of domestic and family violence, sexual assault, and rape, has been awarded a Volunteer Service Grant in the amount of \$20,000 from the W.H.O. (Women Helping Others®) Foundation.

A check presentation will take place on Saturday, September 17 at 6:30 p.m. at the Pinewood Country Club during the Archdale and Adheboro shelter construction celebration.

BeautiControl Independent Executive Director Rachel Harper submitted Randolph County Family Crisis Center to W.H.O. for consideration for the Volunteer Service Grant. She said, “I was thrilled when I found out about the grant because this \$20,000 is the final amount needed to begin construction of the much-needed new kitchen for the shelter.”

Dare Spicer, Executive Director for the Randolph County Family Crisis Center said, “When I received word from our local BeautiControl representative Rachel Harper that we were going to receive the grant from W.H.O. I was ecstatic.”

The W.H.O. grant will be used to renovate the shelter’s kitchen and dining area.
