“I was so excited when I was told W.H.O. selected them for a grant,” Mary Hill told us. “because they make a difference in so many lives! You don’t have to be a painter, a contractor or possess a particular skill, you just have to want to help.”

According to RTSD Executive Director, Pamela Thorsch, “I feel very honored that we were selected by the W.H.O. Foundation. I realize that BeutiControl Consultants work hard throughout the year to contribute and raise funds for organizations like Rebuilding Together San Diego. The lifeline of our organization comes from volunteers, like Mary Hill, who contribute their time and energy to give beyond themselves to help those in need.
